Burglary and Theft Prevention Advice



Put yourself in a burglar's shoes. If you think like them, you can identify security risks around your home.

The following tips can minimise these opportunities:

- Lock your doors and windows including your sheds and garages.
- Photograph / record make, model and serial numbers of valuables.
- Consider engraving your tools and bicycles with your driver's license number.
- Consider installing sensor lights.
- Store ladders away.
- Keep hedges and plants well trimmed - do not give burglars a place to hide.
- Check and maintain damaged fencing and locks.
- Note down and report car registrations and descriptions of suspicious vehicles or persons. Burglars often scope out a place.
